

ASH WEDNESDAY



Welcome

The congregation is invited to stand at this mark *

The imposition of ashes is a Christian practice dating from the 8th century. Ashes were used to signify God's condemnation of sin. Ashes are signs of mourning and repentance. When we receive ashes during the Ash Wednesday worship, we hear the words, "You are dust and to dust you shall return." These are the same words God spoke to Adam, after Adam and Eve disobeyed God's command (Genesis 3:19). They are also words spoken at graveside services and remind us of our mortality.

Ashes are also about cleansing and renewal. They were used in ancient times in the absence of soap, and when we receive them on Ash Wednesday, they remind us of the cleansing that is received through baptism.

The ash cross we wear tonight is a way of saying, "I am sorry for my sins, and I know I need to be forgiven." When we look in the mirror, it is a reminder to ourselves that we need to be forgiven and to forgive others. Ash Wednesday is a serious day, but it is also a hope-filled one. The cross reminds us that God loves and forgives us. Each day is a chance to start over.

Communion will be administered continuously. Come forward by the center aisles, take a communion cup from the table by the front pew, and return by the side aisles. *Grape juice is available for those who prefer grape juice. *Gluten free wafers are located on the oak pedestal on the step in front of the chancel. Communion will be brought to those unable to come forward.

The offerings from the services will go toward the Juniata County Food Pantry.

A time of fellowship and light refreshments will happen immediately following our worship this evening.

^{6:1}As we work together with him, we urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain. ²For he says,

I have listened to you,
and on a day of salvation

I have helped you.”

See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation! ³We are putting no obstacle in anyone’s way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, ⁴but as
